

## CHURCH SHARE CARDS



I have good news to report on our share cards as a fundraiser for our church budget. This past month we received a check from Raley's for \$160.78 for our **Raley's Something Extra Cards**. And we received a check from Food Maxx for \$208.56 on our **Food Maxx Share Cards**. Put the two cards together and we have made \$369.34 for our church budget.

Just swipe your card when you pay for your groceries. A portion of what you spend for your groceries comes back to your church. If you don't have a **Raley's Something Extra Card** you just ask for one while you are shopping in Raley's. Raley's does require you to designate how much you want to come back to your church. Raley's requires you to do this on line on your own computer. If you don't have a computer or you have trouble setting this up see Elaine Kline. If you don't have a **Food Maxx Share Card** see Ginger Ewalt. I understand we just got some new **Food Maxx Share Cards** but your old card still works just fine.

Keep using the cards and help our church budget.

**HAM CASSEROLE**

**LaVerne Battinich**

- 5 oz dry medium-width noodles
- 1 pkg (8 oz) cream cheese at room temperature
- 2/3 C low fat milk
- 1/4 tsp garlic powder
- 1/8 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1 1/2 C cubed cooked ham (8 oz)
- 1/2 C chopped celery
- 2/3 C chopped green pepper
- 1/4 C parmesan cheese, divided

Cook noodles in unsalted water until just barely tender; drain. Stir cream cheese until smooth and gradually add milk until well mixed; add garlic powder and cayenne pepper. Stir in cooked noodles. Into a 1 1/2 quart buttered casserole, put 1/2 of the noodle mixture; add a layer of ham, celery and green pepper. Sprinkle with 1/2 of the parmesan cheese. Repeat layers. Bake at 350° for 50 to 60 minutes. Makes 6 servings.

**CAULIFLOWER SALAD**

- 1 head cauliflower, torn into flowerets
- 1 C thinly sliced radishes
- 1/2 C shredded parsley or watercress
- 1/4 C chopped green onions, tops and all
- 1 C mayonnaise
- 1 C sour cream
- 2 Tbsp caraway seed
- 1 pkg Good Seasons Garlic-Cheese salad dressing

Mix all ingredients together and refrigerate for at least 24 hours ahead of the time you wish to serve.


