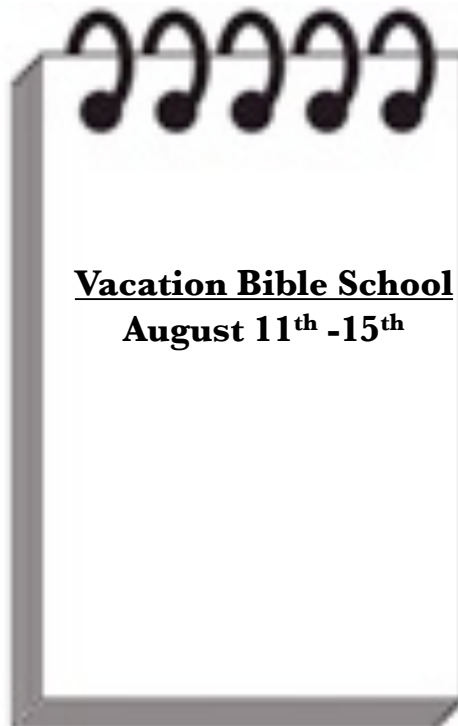

I have good news to report on our share cards as a fundraiser for our church budget. This past month we received a check from Raley's for \$160.78 for our **Raley's Something Extra Cards**. And we received a check from Food Maxx for \$208.56 on our **Food Maxx Share Cards**. Put the two cards together and we have made \$369.34 for our church budget.

Just swipe your card when you pay for your groceries. A portion of what you spend for your groceries comes back to your church. If you don't have a **Raley's Something Extra Card** you just ask for one while you are shopping in Raley's. Raley's does require you to designate how much you want to come back to your church. Raley's requires you to do this on line on your own computer. If you don't have a computer or you have trouble setting this up see Elaine Kline. If you don't have a **Food Maxx Share Card** see Ginger Ewalt. I understand we just got some new **Food Maxx Share Cards** but your old card still works just fine.

CHICKEN ROLL-UPS

- 1 C seasoned breadcrumbs
- 1/2 C parmesan cheese
- 3/4 tsp garlic powder
- 1/4 C sesame seeds
- 2 Tbsp dried parsley
- 1 cube butter or margarine
- 12 to 14 chicken breasts
- 10" foil squares

Mix first five ingredients in a flat dish. Melt butter or margarine. Cut chicken breast in half along breast bone. Dip each breast half in butter and then in crumb mixture. Lay on a foil square and roll up, with ends of foil tucked under. These may be frozen. Take out as many prepared chicken breasts as you wish. Defrost before cooking. Place on a baking sheet sprayed with Pam. Bake at 350° for 35 minutes.

TRUSTEES' CORNER

CA Nevada United Methodist Foundation has been growing the Cochran Trust and the Sandefer Trust quite well, In March 2014, the Cochran Trust was valued at \$174,751 a good growth from \$164,971.62 at March 2013. The interest from this investment and income from the Preschool provided the means for Trustees to take care of the physical needs of the church and the Parsonage.

Now, this is an invitation and reminder that the Peacher Trust is another way to benefit the church, besides direct gifts for special interests. The Peacher Trust can be added to whereas the Cochran Trust is closed, a dedicated gift from the Cochran family. The Peacher Trust has grown from a beginning \$5,000 to \$7,101.81 this year. That's with small gifts given in the past 4 years. Its' interest has been reinvested, so it will continue to grow.

Trustees bought a new commercial disposal for the kitchen, just installed today (4/30/14). Trustees found a good plumber who is an electrician, Kevin albert, who has benefited us by installing new overhead lights at the church entry, installed anew cooktop at the parsonage and has brought samples of theater-type lights for the Sanctuary. He is a young man from Orland that is knowledgeable and capable. I like his work a lot and will ask him to install a water filter at the parsonage as the church cannot afford new pipes at the parsonage. Their water is brown, the electric switch in their "fireplace" room is broken. The family has need of repaired water lines for the yard. The church needs gifts to keep coming. Please remember the Peacher Trust as well as dedicated offerings to help the Parsonage.
