

1	tsp	salt



1	$\mathbf{C}$	mashed persimmon pulp
1	tsp	soda
1	$\mathbf{C}$	sugar
1	$\mathbf{C}$	flour
$^{1}/_{2}$	tsp	(each) baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg
1		egg
3	Tbsp	oil
1	tsp	vanilla
1	$\overline{\mathbf{C}}$	raisins or dates
1/2 to	1	C nuts, chopped

Mix persimmon pulp and soda and let set. Mix sugar, flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg together; add persimmon, egg, oil and vanilla. After mixing well, add raisins or dates and nuts. Bake in loaf pan at 350° for 1 hour. Slice and serve with whip cream or Cool Whip as a dessert, or with cream cheese as a sweet bread.

We didn't receive anything from our Raley's Something Extra Cards during August but we have received \$319.51 for the year to date. Put the two cards together and we have received a total of \$883.78 this year. The Food Maxx Share Cards and The Raley's Something Extra Cards are great fundraisers for our church.

Just swipe your card when you pay for your groceries. A portion of what you spend for your groceries comes back to our church. If you don't have a Raley's Something Extra Card just ask for a card while you are shopping in Raley's. Raley's does require that you designate how much you want to come back to your church. You are required to do this on your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up see Elaine Kline. If you don't have a Food Maxx Share Card see Ginger Ewalt.


