

Oroville

In Oroville, close to 75 people gathered on the green bridge for a Memorial Day ceremony, following a commemoration at the Oroville Memorial Park on Lincoln Boulevard. Guests in red, white and blue and veterans from World War II and wars in Korea, Vietnam and Afghanistan sat around the bridge, nodding to one another when they spotted someone who had fought in the same war they had.

“Each generation must be reminded of the cost of freedom. The freedom to use your iPhone, the freedom to cut school and stay out late, the freedom to say stupid things on Facebook and the freedom to go to school and do anything you’d like,” keynote speaker Jack Berry said. “Freedom isn’t free.”

The bridge ceremony featured a speech, music from the Nelson Avenue School Band and Pastor David Rieck, as well as a wreath ceremony and invocation.

Vietnam and Desert Storm veteran Stephen Adams attended the ceremonies in both Chico and Oroville on Monday.

“Today is a special day,” Adams said. “I went to both to remember the veterans that have gone before us. We can’t forget what they have done for this country.”

Throughout the hour-long ceremony, dozens of cars drove by, many with boats in tow. As the bell tolled, passersby slowed, sometimes honking and waving as they were reminded of the solemnity of the day.

Just below the ceremony, people floated down the Feather River before they were showered with red and white flowers thrown from the bridge into the river.



We are looking forward to celebrating this very special time in Christl's life.


USE OF CHURCH FACILITIES

| 1 Tbsp honey mustard | 1/4 tsp celery salt (may use celery seed) |
| 1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper | 1/4 tsp onion powder |
| 3 C diced cooked chicken | 1 1/2 C seedless green grapes, halved |
| 1 C chopped celery | 3/4 C sliced scallions, including tops |
| 1/4 C chopped almonds, toasted | |

In a large bowl, combine mayonnaise, sour cream, mustard, celery salt, pepper and onion powder; mix well. Add chicken, grapes, celery and scallions; toss until well mixed. Stir in the almonds. Makes 4 servings.

**UPDATE ON HOW OUR SHARES CARDS ARE
DOING FOR OUR CHURCH BUDGET**

Our **Food Maxx Shares Program** has made **\$434.97** so far this year as a fundraiser for our church budget. We just received a check this month for **\$196.05**. We receive a check about once every three months. We no longer can use the shares card. Just put in the church phone number **(530)534-9455** in the keypad and touch the green button when you pay for your groceries. The **Raley's Something Extra Card** has made **\$151.13** so far this year for our church budget. We receive a check about once every three months for the Raley's card. We received a check from Raley's just last month. We still have a card at Raley's. If you don't have a Raley's card ask for a card the next time you shop at Raley's. You are required to designate how much you want to come back to the church when we use our Raley's card. You can do this from your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up ask **Jeremy Buis** to help you. We get money from Food Maxx and Raley's every three months. The **UMC Market has made \$23.10** so far this year for our church budget. The UMC Market is when you purchase things on the internet. Many stores participate. See the article of what stores in the feather. You can read about the UMC Market in The Feather each month. Remember Food Maxx, Raley's and UMC Market when you shop. Put all three together and we have made **\$609.20** so far this year for our church budget. What an easy to help our church budget.

Now all you have to do is put in a telephone number. You just put a telephone number in the key pad when you pay for your groceries and touch the green button.

If you want to use your own telephone number you must log in on your own computer at www.escrip.com. Then sign up to use your own phone number. You must have an e-mail to do this. If you don't have an e-mail to make it easier for you Jeremy Buis has set up the church phone number for all of us to use. Just put in the church phone number in the keypad 5305349455 and hit the green button. That is all you have to do. I tried it and it works. I tried signing up but I had problems so I just use the church phone number. This is a great fundraiser for our church budget. We make about \$300.00 every three months for our church.

- **Vegetable Juice (16 oz and under only)...** *for example:* V8 100% Vegetable Juice, Odwalla Carrot Juice, Campbell's Tomato Juice
- **"Sport" drinks...** *for example:* Powerade, Gatorade
