

JUNE

This is the dessert that was served recently at the Ross-Harmon Educator of the Year dinner. Janet Short provided the recipe.

Strawberry and Lemon Cream Roulade

To prepare, 20 minutes; bakes in 25 minutes

1 package angel food cake mix Powdered sugar 6 or 7 cups strawberries

Lemon Cream

1 package (8 ounce) cream cheese, softened ½ cup powdered sugar
1 tablespoon lemon juice
2 teaspoons grated lemon zest

Heat your oven to 350 degrees. Line a 10 x 15-inch jelly roll baking pan with parchment or waxed paper. (Do not grease.)

Prepare cake mix as package directs. Pour batter into prepared pan, spreading evenly to the edges. Bake 20 to 24 minutes or until golden brown and top springs back when touched lightly. While still warm, loosen cake from edges of pan; turn upside down onto large clean lint-free towel. Remove the parchment paper and sprinkle with powdered sugar. Roll up cake with towel, beginning at the short end; cool on wire rack. Meanwhile, in a mixing bowl, beat all ingredients for Lemon Cream until smooth and creamy. On clean surface, unroll cake. Trim any hard edges from the cake. Spread evenly with filling to within ½ inch of edges. Cut 2 cups strawberries into slices; arrange in even layer over filling. Roll up; transfer seam side down, to serving platter.

Cover and refrigerate 30 minutes to firm filling. In blender container, process 2 cups of strawberries until smooth; sweeten with sugar if necessary. Set aside. Cut remaining strawberries into quarters. To serve, sprinkle top of cake with powdered sugar; cut into 12 slices. Serve each on individual dessert plate with ¼ cup quartered strawberries and about 1 tablespoon strawberry sauce.

Makes 12 servings; about 239 calories per serving.

served. It was topped off with a large mother's day cake to honor all of the ladies.




