Sunday School Happenings at FUMC

On Sunday August 26th the kids were a large part worship service for Heifer and Promotion Sunday. The kids sang two songs they learned in Sunday School, "If I were a Butterfly" and This Little Light of Mine".

The kids also helped Pastor Donna with her sermon by passing out mustard seeds. This was to symbolize Jesus giving his disciples a mustard seed and telling them that the kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which when planted starts out small yet when it grows becomes the largest of garden plants and becomes a a tree. Matthew 13 31-32.



One highlight of the worship service was the kids announced they raised \$728.68 for the Heifer Project with recycling that the congregation brought to church. The kids encouraged the congregation all year to bring in their recycling and it paid off in spades! The kids chose what animals were to be purchased as well that Sunday. The kids chose a trio of rabbits, one sheep, I flock of chickens, one water buffalo, one pig, and one Llama.

The kids continue to learn and grow in God's love and faith. They tend to their garden every Sunday and are seeing the fruits (or in this case vegetables) of their labor. Pastor Laura told the kids that people from the trailer park next to our church are coming by regularly to pick thru the garden for fresh and healthy vegetables. They kids have seen first hand by planting a tiny seed that amazing things can grow just like the kingdom of heaven.

World Communion Sunday

In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America established Worldwide Communion Sunday as a global, interdenominational event. Prompted by the impact of World War II, the Methodist Church received an offering on this Sunday for the Fellowship of Suffering and Service. In 1971, The United Methodist Church changed the name of the observance to World Communion Sunday and redistributed the offering to support the Crusade Scholarship Program (begun in 1944), the Ethnic Minority Scholarship Program and the Division of Chaplains and Related Ministries. In 1980, Chaplains and Related Ministries was moved to World Service funding, but the World Communion Sunday offering continued to assist ethnic minority persons pursuing various avenues of ministry. In 2008, "Crusade Scholars" became "World Communion Scholars."




We have some baskets if you need a basket. If you like we are more than happy to put the basket together for you, if you bring the items to us.


